STEP 1

READ THE INFORMATION PACKET Go over all the information included in this packet as it contains important details regarding summer camp rules, schedules, field trips, etc.

STEP 2

FILL OUT THE REGISTRATION FORM Fill out the entire registration form. All information is kept private and is used solely in an emergency or if the parents/guardians must be notified.

STEP 3

PROVIDE NECESSARY DOCUMENTS The school is required to have a copy of the camper's passport and proof of the following immunizations:

- 4 Polio 2 MMR Varicella
- 5 DPT 3 Hep B

The student will not be allowed to attend summer camp without official record of necessary immunizations, required by state law.

STEP 4

PAY REGISTRATION FEE & DEPOSITS A \$100 registration fee is non-refundable and covers one camp T-shirt, office records, and student accident insurance. A \$25 deposit must be paid in order to hold your child's spot for each week he/she plans on attending camp (space fills up quickly, and some weeks have to be closed).

STEP 5

Once all the paperwork is completed and fees are paid, then your child is officially enrolled in camp! Weekly tuition and lunch can be paid on or before Monday mornings. Camp T-shirts are given out on the camper's first day. We look forward to having a great summer with you!

HALF-DAY ACADEMICS PROGRAM 8:30 AM - 11:30 AM MON - FRI

The morning academic program provides **academic reinforcement** during the long summer months - idle weeks can be turned into productive, mind-stimulating weeks.

Eight weeks of instruction are provided in math, reading, writing, science, history, Bible, and more.

Morning academics are taught four days a week (Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday) from 8:30 a.m. until 11:30 a.m. This schedule is coordinated with the all-day program to provide an all-encompassing full-day and full-week program.

An **E.L.L. (English Learning Language**) class is offered for non- and limited-English speaking campers to further enhance speaking, reading, and writing English.

Tuition for morning academics program (\$220 per week) **covers all supplies, books, and before-school care** (7:00 a.m. until 8:30 a.m.). The registration fee covers office records, student accident insurance, emergency preparedness supplies, and one camp T-shirt.

ALL-DAY PROGRAM 8:00 AM - 5:30 PM MON - FRI

The all-day program includes the morning academics program and all activities on and off campus at a reduced price. All-day program tuition (\$350 for 1st-5th grades, \$375 for 6th-10th grades per week) covers all supplies, books, field trip transportation, entrance fees, activities, and before and after-school care (8:00 a.m. until 5:30 p.m.).

Activities are scheduled after morning academics (Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday) and all-day on Wednesday. All off-campus activities are carefully supervised with one counselor for every eight to ten campers.

Hot lunches are served on a daily basis (except Wednesday) in the school cafeteria for \$5.50 (1st-4th grade) and \$6.50 (5th-10th grade), unless designated otherwise. All lunches must be paid in cash or check

For days when water activities are taking place (i.e. water wars, beach days, water parks), campers **must wear their swimsuit under regular clothes** and bring a towel. **Flip-flops are allowed on these days only!** Otherwise, closed-toe shoes must be worn to camp. Also, be sure to wear socks for skating and bowling.

NEW FOR 2019: S.T.E.A.M. CLASSES!

In addition to our All Day Program, we are **now offering our new STEAM classes for grades 3 and up**. Our STEAM classes will take place every Monday and Friday starting July 1st. Each class is an additional \$10 to cover all class materials. Students will get hands-on learning experiences in the subjects of science, technology, engineering, art, and math.



SUMMER CAMP POLICIES



REGISTRATION

A \$100.00 **registration fee is non-refundable** and covers one camp T-shirt, office records, and student accident insurance (summer camp medical insurance is intended to supplement family policies).

An additional \$25.00 deposit per week, is due upon registration for each week your child is registered to attend camp. Deposits are non-refundable and may not be applied toward any other week. This deposit will secure your child a spot in the camp for each week registered. A space in the camp cannot be guaranteed if this deposit is not made.

FEES (HALF-DAY ACADEMICS)

Tuition is \$220.00 and is **due by Monday morning** of that week's classes. **A late fee of \$10.00 will be charged** if weekly fees are not paid by the close of camp each Monday (5:30 p.m.). **Sorry, no refunds or credits are available.**

There is a late pick-up charge of \$8.00 for any portion of 15 minutes per camper not picked up by 11:45 a.m. If it becomes necessary to take the camper on that day's activity, the fee for that day's activity will be charged and is payable at the time of pick-up.

FEES (ALL-DAY PROGRAM)

Tuition is \$350.00 for 1st-5th grade students and \$375.00 for 6th-10th grade students. Fees are **due by Monday morning** of each week. Campers will not be allowed to participate in classes or activities if tuition has not been paid for that week. **A late fee of \$10.00** will be charged if weekly fees are not paid by the close of camp each Monday (5:30 p.m.). **Sorry, no refunds or credits are available.**

Please note that there is an **additional \$30 fee** for the Disneyland, and Universal Studios field trip.

There is a late pick-up charge of \$8.00 for any portion of 15 minutes per camper **not picked up by 5:30 p.m.** Payment is due at the time of pick-up.

RETURNED CHECKS

A \$35.00 fee will be charged for checks returned by the bank for any reason. Payment by cash or money order may also be required if your check is returned.

STUDENT TRAVELER'S INSURANCE

Southlands Schools International does not provide primary medical coverage for traveling students. In case of any emergency or accident, it is required that students are covered by traveler's insurance.

LUNCHES & SNACK CARDS

All campers need to bring money to purchase lunch on all trips unless otherwise specified. There may be **occasions** when campers need to bring a sack lunch. When we are on campus, hot lunches are offered for \$5.50 (1st-4th grade) and \$6.50 (5th-10th grade).

Snack cards may be purchased for our The Nest which offers morning and afternoon snacks for campers.

CAMP T-SHIRTS

Each camper is issued one camp T-shirt as a part of their registration. Camp T-shirts must be worn on all Wednesday field trips. Campers will not be able to attend the field trip if they fail to wear a camp T-shirt. Sorry, no exceptions! Extra T-shirts are available for purchase for \$10.00. Any child who arrives on Wednesday without a camp T-shirt will be given a new one and charged \$10.00, which is payable at the time of pick-up.

FIELD TRIPS & SPENDING MONEY

On days where we visit amusement parks, we reserve the right to exclude students who are not willing to participate or who do not want to get on the rides.

The Summer Camp staff is not responsible for money lost on campus or on field trips. Camp counselors carry spending money for 1st-5th grade campers.

PERSONAL ITEMS

Campers are responsible for any personal items brought to summer camp. The camp is not responsible for any lost or broken items. **No electronic toys, games, cell phones, iPods, iPads, etc.** will be permitted without camp approval.

Lockers are available and recommended for 6th-10th grade campers; however, there is a \$5.00 deposit for all locks and is refundable at the end of camp.

Backpacks or other bags are not allowed on field trips; however, fanny packs are allowed. Campers are encouraged to bring water bottles from home. The camp will not be responsible for any lost backpacks or bags.

DRESS CODE

Clean, neat, modest, and appropriate - clothing should be appropriately functional for activities in which the students will attend and participate in. Girls must wear a one-piece swimsuit or a T-shirt covering any two-piece swimsuit. No crop tops, spaghetti straps, or low-cut tops. Midriffs must be covered at all times.

No sandals or open-toed shoes are allowed. Sandals and open-toed shoes are only permitted on water activity days (i.e. water wars, water parks). Campers will not be allowed to participate in camp activities if they are not wearing appropriate shoes.

DISCIPLINE STATEMENT

It is our desire to maintain an atmosphere where your child will have the best time, in the safest environment possible. Campers are at all times, expected to respect the authority of the camp counselors and staff. Obedience, wholesome speech, honesty, and respect for private property and the rights of others is essential. If a camper's behavior is not acceptable, disciplinary measures will be taken. In persistent cases or extreme behavior (i.e. fighting, swearing, theft), the camper will be asked to leave for the day, and possibly for the remainder of the camp.
